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From Mourning to Comfort

Each summer, the Jewish calendar brings us through a season that begins with sorrow but does not end there. Tisha B'Av calls Israel to remember the destruction of the Temples, the fall of Jerusalem, and the griefs that have marked our people's history. Yet the weeks that follow point us toward comfort, restoration, and renewed hope in the faithfulness of G-d.

This movement from mourning to comfort is deeply rooted in the prophets. Isaiah declares, "Comfort, comfort my people, says your G-d" (Isaiah 40:1). These words do not erase grief, nor do they pretend that loss is small. Rather, they reveal that G-d speaks comfort into real sorrow, promising that judgment, exile, and ruin will not have the final word over His covenant people.

For Messianic believers, this hope finds its center in Messiah Yeshua, not only as Israel's promised Rescuer, but as the divine Son. He wept over Jerusalem, yet He also came to bring atonement and open the way for restoration. In Him, mourning is not ignored; it is answered.

Yeshua does not call us to shallow comfort, but to a comfort grounded in repentance, mercy, and restoration. He meets us in our failings and loss, yet He does not leave us there. By His life, death, resurrection, and ascension, He points us toward the promised renewal of all things.

As we move through these summer months, may we learn to mourn what is broken, repent where we have strayed, and receive the comfort G-d gives through Messiah. The ruins are real, but so is the promise. In Yeshua, sorrow is not the end of the story; redemption is.

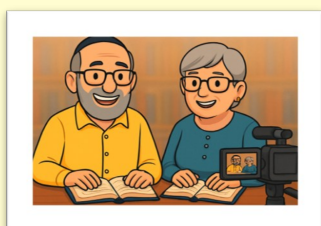
